

Visitor Center and Museum

A small museum is located in the 1933 Bathhouse next to the parking lot. It is open between 8:00 AM and 4:30 PM as staffing permits. Exhibits on natural and cultural resources are on display.

Picnic Area

Six picnic tables without grills are available on a first-come first-serve basis. Restrooms are available in the nearby visitor center which is open from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM daily (closed some holidays). Portable toilets are also located in the picnic area.

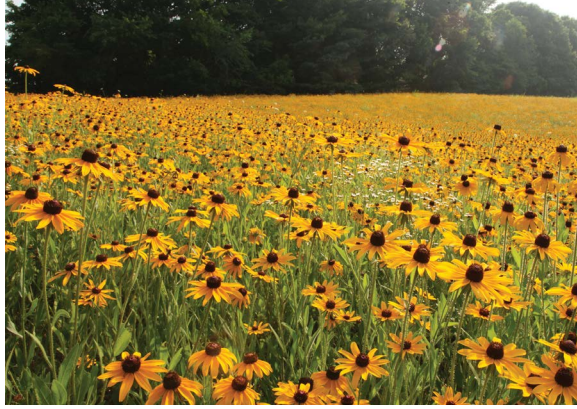

Hiking

Hiking trails range from the 0.45-mile Lake Trail which takes you around and the lake and wetlands, the 0.75 mile Grassland Trail through the restored prairie (above), the 0.65-mile Short Loop, and the 1.45-mile Recovery Trail. The Short Loop and Recovery Trails take you into the forest and over successional fields.



Directions

Take I-24 to Exit 8, (Rossvie Road). Turn left on Rossvie Road. Travel 0.25-miles to Dunbar Cave Road. Turn left on Dunbar Cave Road. The park entrance is 2.50-miles on the right.
